Handywoman Sharon Otty commented, "It is rewarding to help others keep their independence." Last but not least, handyman Joe Montanio who has been with the program since September 2018 said, "I like everything about the Umbrella Program."

For more extensive repairs, we offer referrals to licensed professionals who will work with a member at a discounted rate. There are also some great benefits in becoming an Umbrella Member including carbon monoxide and smoke detector installation, quarterly

HEATING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) provides financial assistance with heating costs to low income residents.

Monthly gross income cannot exceed \$2,494 for individuals and \$3,262 for

couples. If you receive Food Stamps and live alone, you will receive an automatic benefit and do not need to apply. If you have received HEAP in the past, you will receive a renewal application in the mail.

Application assistance during the HEAP season is available through the Town's Senior Resources Department at The Beltrone Living Center on December 11 and January 15. Applications will be accepted for both senior and non-senior town residents. Appointments are required. For more information, please call the Senior Resources Department at 518-459-5051, ext. 2.

AARP TAX ASSISTANCE

Tax assistance will again be provided through AARP and the Town's Senior Resources Department for the 2019/20 tax season on Mondays at Colonie Town Hall and Wednesdays at the Crossings.
