Launched in September 2019, **THE CENTER** at CSSC was created to promote lifelong learning, positive interaction and socialization. The idea of **THE CENTER** came to me when I thought about the many Elderhostels I helped host as a young woman in the museum field. Every summer we would receive groups of older adults from all over the world who immersed themselves in studying the Shakers for a week or two while staying in the dorms at one of our local colleges or universities. As a "twenty-something", these seniors yearning to learn and discover absolutely fascinated me. In my book, they were cool.

Elderhostel is actually a nonprofit organization that provides educational opportunities and learning adventures to individuals age 55 or older. Now known as Road Scholars, they organize trips that include lectures, discussions and cultural outings in 90 countries around the world as well as in all 50 states.

Borrowing their model but at a local level, **THE CENTER** was born. Under the direction of Caroline Barrett, CSSC's Lifelong Wellness Director, **THE CENTER** has flourished. She has added a wonderful wide variety of options and opportunities for **CENTER** members to take advantage of.

For \$20 a year, a person can be as busy as they want to be with a **CENTER** membership. Residents in CSSC's three senior communities (Sheehy, Beltrone and King Thiel) receive a **CENTER** membership free-of-charge. If you are not already a member, think about joining. You will be happy you did!


May's Healthy and Local Cooking Class – Farm Fresh Korean Cuisine

You are the caregiver and you have done well!


Italian Night with The Good Times Band


