Umbrella of Colonie is a vital program of CSSC. The annual membership fee is based upon a senior's gross income. For low income seniors, Elder Program Initiatives (EPI) scholarships are available. All handy people services, regardless of task, are paid \$15.00 an hour.

Keeping our members safe is our priority. In this regard, there are benefits to joining. For instance, Umbrella of Colonie collaborates with the American Red Cross to make sure all our members have working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in their homes. Another benefit of becoming an Umbrella member is free Defensive Driving Classes which are held at The Beltrone Living Center twice a month.

Our handy people take pride and exceed the scope of their work. Many handy people view involvement as a way of giving back to the community. We are continuously recruiting new handy people to be a part of our wonderful team. In May, CSSC was awarded a grant from The Michele L. Vennard Hospitality Grant Program of the Albany County Convention and Visitor's Bureau Fund, a fund of the Community Foundation for the Greater Capital Region, that was established to support Albany County's hospitality industry by funding programs that will help build and sustain Albany County tourism destinations, attractions and events and bring more visitors to the County.



## **Bright Horizons Interns**

We are very fortunate at Bright Horizons to have the opportunity to work with student interns from Hudson Valley Community College, Siena College, St. Rose College and the State University of NY at Albany, the School of Social Welfare. Students who are studying Social Work, or Health Services Administration as their main concentration are the students who intern with us at Bright Horizons. We have learning contracts with these institutions and work closely with the academic departments in the placement of students for our program. Students are assigned by Academic Advisors and interviewed by Bright Horizons staff. The students provide us with a current health assessment and TB test, show proof of COVID vaccination and complete an orientation and training. The students receive a combination of socialization with clients and caregivers, immersion in program activities and knowledge of administrative tasks. They learn about other services which are provided by Colonie Senior Service Centers for seniors living in the community. We have trained interns as in-home adult day social respite volunteers for our Bright Horizons Bridge to Respite Program. These volunteers provide adult day social programming to seniors in need while at the same time providing respite for the caregiver. Come join our team for a semester or a full year. You will certainly gain guite an experience, and a wealth of knowledge from our senior population.
