She was in the process of cleaning out her home of sixty-six years to move in with her daughter and came across a well-worn black-n-white photo of my Great Aunt "Frannie" (Frances) and her husband Ed, and thought I would be the one she would send it to. Receiving that 5x7 photo from the 1940s made my day, possibly my month.

Now, I know you should never choose favorites but, Aunt Frannie and Uncle Ed were mine. They were incredible human beings, never an unkind word, wise as the day is long and the best sense of humor you would ever wish for.

He worked at ESF, she was a homemaker, and the love and respect they alway showed one another was commendable. They had no children of their own but treated me and my brothers like gold when they visited. They owned a beautiful historic home on South Salina Street in Syracuse complete with stain glass windows, incredible woodwork, a butler's pantry in between the kitchen and formal dining room, as well as an artist studio on the second floor in the back where my uncle painted. Boy, how we loved and admired them.

Ed passed in 1980 at 71, Frannie in 1982 at 68. Forty years later, my feelings for them are the same. Receiving that photo was truly a gift, "A Moment in Time" that brought back special memories.



One of my favorite aspects of working for Colonie Senior Service Centers is the day-to-day interaction with our seniors. Between our housing opportunities and all our community programs and services, we have the pleasure of interacting with thousands of seniors annually, many of whom we may have known growing up. Some were our teachers, our neighbors, our parents' friends, past coworkers and other members of our community.

In the end, it is not the years in your life that matter. It is the life lived in those years that count.

January's Outing - French anyone?



Sacred Spaces

The Church of St. John the Evangelist

The journey continues Tuesday, January 17, at 10:00 a.m., as we take a trip to The Church of St. John the Evangelist located at 806 Union Street in Schenectady.

Completed in 1899, St John the Evangelist, in the Union Street Historic District (NHRP), is the result of a collaboration between the pastor and architect. The pastor, Monsignor John L. Reilly, outlined the design of the church from inspiration collected while traveling in Europe. Many American churches have been inspired by their pastors' European grand tour, but the end result in this case is not the obvious replica that resulted in the vast majority.

The "supervising architect" (as he is credited in multiple accounts) was Edward Loth, an architect from Troy who had studied in Germany. This is the most dramatic and unusual of his church designs. Loth also designed a number of churches in towns around Albany including Ballston Spa and Watervliet.

The CSSC shuttle bus will leave The Beltrone Living Center at 10:00 a.m. and will return at approximately 12:00 noon. This outing will require some walking.


