Sikh gurudwara in Rensselaer

The journey continues on Wednesday, January 31st at 10:00 a.m. as Diane will lead a trip to the Sikh gurudwara located at 301 Washington Avenue in Rensselaer.

The word 'Sikh' means 'one who learns.' Sikhs believe in devotion to one true God, to earn an honest living and to share it with humanity. They uphold values of compassion, humility, spirituality, climate change, social justice and gender equality. Sikhs emphasize sustainability; The air is their teacher, the water is the father and the earth is the mother.

A gurdwara or gurudwara is a place of assembly and worship for Sikhs. People from all faiths and religions are welcomed in gurdwaras. Founded almost 40 years ago, the East Greenbush gurudwara was the first in upstate New York. In 2012, it moved to larger premises in Rensselaer.

The CSSC shuttle bus will leave The Beltrone Living Center at 9:40 a.m. and will return at approximately 11:30 a.m. The cost of this trip is \$10 dollars.

If you are lucky, you might be able to spot a very special animal living on the campus of King Thiel Senior Community, a piebald deer.

Piebald deer are extremely rare with white spots on a pigmented background. All piebald deer have a unique pattern with brown eyes and noses. Native American tribes considered piebald deer to be embodiments of spirits passing to or from the spirit world. Seeing a piebald deer meant that change was coming. The Native American population carried profound respect for the piebald deer population.

Winter Safety

Tips for walking safely on icy surfaces:

Wear gloves – don't keep hands in pockets

Keep hands free use a backpack to carry items

Stay on designated walkways

Wear footwear meant for traction

Point feet out; extend arms to side for balance

Walk like a penguin: short steps or shuffle

Use special care when entering/exiting vehicle
