## **Meals that Care**

In response to community requests, CSSC announced back in the fall of 2022 the start of a program called Meals that Care. This initiative, supported by generous donations from the community, Highmark, Goldstein Auto Group, and the Estate of Larry Siegel, supports those most in need; homebound, vulnerable, or ill community members living within a 5-mile radius of The Beltrone Living Center. Meals that Care is different from most home delivered meal programs as it aims to support those who are truly ill, in treatment, or in recovery and are unable to cook for themselves. The goal is to support a short-term need until an individual gets back on their feet and are able to care for their own needs again.

If you or your loved one is incapacitated and unable to cook, please consider this initiative. CSSC will accept requests for hot meals ordered at a fixed cost of \$10 per meal.
