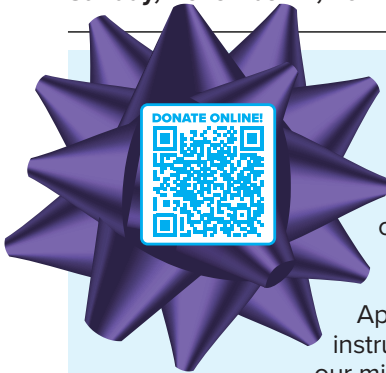

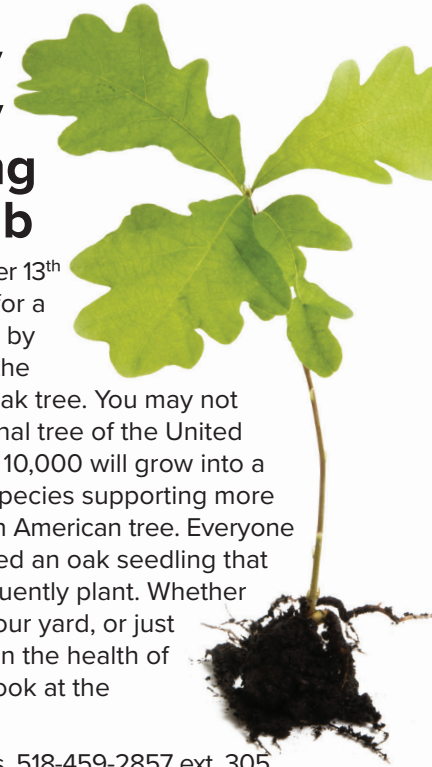

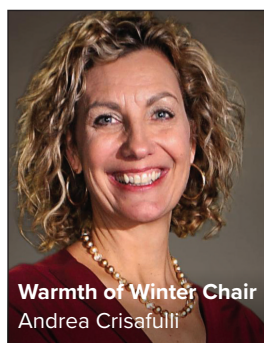




## Thank you to the U.S. Department of State and ICCR

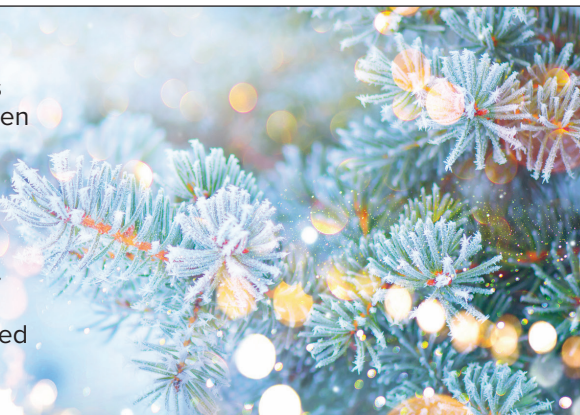
