Beltrone Resident Named Grand Marshal of Albany Veterans Day Parade

It is with great pride that we announce Sergeant James A. Dandles, a resident of The Beltrone Living Center, has been named Grand Marshal of the 2024 Albany Veterans Day Parade. Dandles served in the Army from 1965 until he was honorably discharged in 1967. He also assisted in spearheading efforts to honor local black military WWI hero Henry Johnson, including petitions to rename Northern Boulevard to Henry Johnson Boulevard and the dedication of a memorial statue in his honor in Albany. He also worked with other veterans to have Johnson posthumously awarded the Purple Heart in 1996 and the Medal of Honor in 2015. Dandles spoke of the importance of honoring this local legend, saying it was long overdue. Along with Dandles' extensive volunteer and community service, the honor of Grand Marshal is just one more impressive feather in his cap of achievements. While Dandles states he is both excited and nervous about the parade, he sure is glad to they'll have a car for him to ride in! Dandles has lived at The Beltrone for five years with his wife Cora. From all of us at Colonie Senior Service Centers, congratulations, Jim! The historic Veterans Day parade will be held on Monday, November 11 in downtown Albany.
